Requirements prior to End Point Assessment

English and maths Level 2 must be achieved prior to completing your end point assessment. For those with an education, health and care plan or legacy statement, the requirement is Level 3. British Sign Language is an alternative for whom this is their primary language.

ASSOCIATE PROJECT MANAGER

Associate project managers need good planning, organisation, leadership, management, and communication skills. They utilise resources with suitable skills, qualifications, experience, and knowledge to work together in an integrated team, with clearly defined reporting lines, roles, and responsibilities. An associate project manager knows what needs to be achieved, how it will be achieved, how long it will take and how much it will cost and works with the project team to achieve the required outcomes. Dependent upon the size of the organisations and the complexity of projects, associate project managers' job titles will vary, but typically they can include assistant project manager, junior project manager, project team leader.
