



Becoming a Practice Supervisor (PS)

Am I eligible?

A Practice Supervisor is any registered professional. For example, a Nurse, Paramedic, Physiotherapist or even a Nursing Associate once qualified. They must be registered with a professional regulator like the NMC, GMC or HCPC. They can support Pre-reg Nursing students, Trainee Nursing Associates, Pre-reg Paramedics, Pre-reg Social Workers, etc

How does the training work?

You will need to take a half day e-learning module run by the Training Hub, <u>Pan London Practice Learning Group</u> or by Canterbury Christ Church University or University of Greenwich For more information on the module click <u>here</u>

Will my practice support me?

Your practice should allocate you time to support the students Your practice should release you for your training

What can I do as a PS?

- Serve as role models for safe and effective practice
- Support and supervise students, providing feedback on their progress
- Share current knowledge and experience of the area in which they are providing support
- Support learning in line with their scope of practice
- Support the Practice Assessors (PAs)
