There are 2 routes to become a First Contact Practitioner (FCP)

Route 1:

Educational Supervisor (GP Trainer) top-up training

For General Practitioner Educational Supervisors (GP trainers)

The video offers voluntary top up training to GPs who have already trained as Educational Supervisors. It is available on Health Education England's e-learning for healthcare Hub. The resource provides an overview of the differences between a First Contact Practitioner and an Advanced Practitioner and explains what masters level practice is and how this is evidenced in a portfolio.

- Be able to understand masters level practice
- Gain understanding of allied health professionals' offer to primary care and their specific roadmap
- Gain understanding of the background of the educational roadmaps and the advanced practice agenda
