This usually requires qualified dietary counselling to completely exclude all sources of cows' milk protein from the mothers' diet. If a decision to use a special formula intended for infants is taken, it is important to follow the instructions on the label. Unboiled water, unboiled bottles, or incorrect dilution can make babies ill. Incorrect storage, handling, preparation, and feeding can eventually lead to adverse effects on the health of babies. Formula for special medical purposes intended for infants must be used under medical supervision.
